This is a form we can use to scaffold learning conversations with students. If you find the questions don't meet your needs, change them accordingly (keeping them aligned with the school's Learning Principles).

\* Blue colour: Learning Principle(s) which relate to the Question(s).

Questions about Learning	Student Responses
<b>What are you learning today?</b> <b>What are you learning about?</b>	
Understand the purpose	
<b>Why do you think this is important?</b> <b>Is it connected to something that you have learned before?</b>	
Build connections Inquire Relate experiences to real life	
<b>Are you learning something new or practicing something you already know?</b>	
Reflect on the experience	
<b>Is this learning challenging you? Too easy? Too hard? Just right?</b> <b>How do you know how successful you are in learning this?</b>	
Face appropriate challenges Reflect on the experience Seek feedback	
<b>How do you find the pace of the lesson? Too fast, too slow, just right?</b>

<b>What helps your learning in this class?</b> <b>What gets in the way of your learning?</b>	
Understand thought processes Engage actively	
<b>How do you feel supported in this class?</b> <b>How do you support others in this class?</b>	
Receive and offer support and care Collaborate effectively	
<b>How do you use feedback from the teacher and your peers to improve your learning?</b>	
Seek feedback Collaborate effectively Reflect on the experience Take ownership	
<b>What opportunities do you have to develop your own interest in this area?</b>	
Take ownership Inquire Relate experiences to real life	
<b>What do you know now that you didn't know before? Why?</b>
